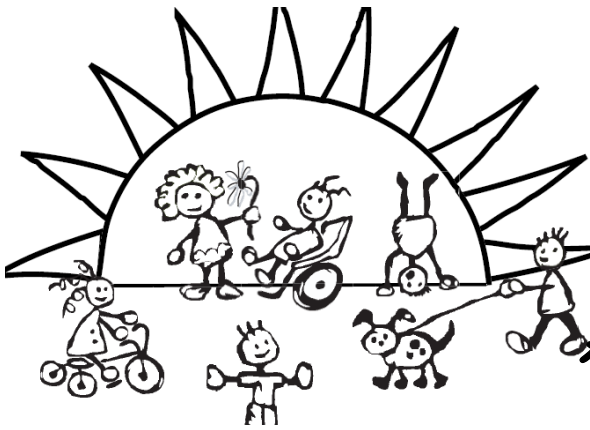
Audit Committee seeks new members
