

## CSCSD BOARD OF EDUCATION GOALS

### 2022-2023 Goals

#### **GOAL 1: Student Achievement and participation.**

The Campbell-Savona Board of Education will dedicate quality Board meeting time to the review of student data for general education students and students at risk to reflect growth and achievement of the whole child consistent with state learning standards, 21st century skills, co-curricular achievement of our students.

##### **Purpose and relevance of goal:**

- 1) Focus on student achievement for all students. Presentations should include information on how we provide differentiated instruction to all types of students, including those in need of extra supports as well as high-performing students.
- 2) Data-driven assessment review on a quarterly basis to include Graduation Rate, BOCES rank, Tenure %, Regent's exam data, etc....
- 3) Involvement of Board of Education in curriculum and instruction to bring Board in touch with student progress via presentations, demonstrations, and public displays of learning in addition to monitoring data and to deepen board members' understandings of all school programs
- 4) Recognize student achievement at the regional state and/or national level.
- 5) Keeping current on co-curricular programs that contribute to the "whole child"

**Timeline:** Presentations and activities will occur throughout the school year; Survey Monkey questionnaires will be sent immediately after presentations/activities occur

##### **Evaluation plan of goal achievement:**

- (1) List of BOE presentations and curriculum related activities
- (2) Completed questionnaire data to be reviewed at 2023 BOE retreat
- (3) New schedule of educational and co-curricular programs which includes programs not yet presented to the board and year/month of review

#### **Goal 2: Communication**

The Campbell-Savona Board of Education will create a Communication Committee to review and improve the District's communication with the public.

##### **Purpose and Relevance of goal:**

To improve the methods and types of communication with the public. Decisions the District makes effects the entire community, but often the community does not feel that they receive timely updates on our work.

**Timeline:** The committee will stay in place for as long as it deems necessary to complete its work. Progress should be reviewed annually.

##### **Evaluation plan of goal achievement:**

- 1) Communication committee meets regularly to review our processes and suggest new means of communication.
- 2) Methods of communication may include, but not be limited to:
  - a. Board of Education column in the school newsletter
  - b. Board of Education meeting brochure
  - c. Personal letters to faculty, staff, and students for outstanding achievements
  - d. Videos

**GOAL 3 – The Board of Education will seek to expand its engagement with elected officials to help support the work of the District and advocate for sensible laws, regulations, and funding sources for the important work done by the District.**

**Purpose and relevance of goal:**

The laws and regulations that impact the work of the District come from higher levels of government. In order to best serve our students and community, the District needs to use its experience and expertise to advocate for sensible laws that help the District with its work of providing the best possible education for our students.

**Evaluation plan of goal achievement:**
