\* *To the extent required by the applicable provisions of Education Law Sections 2509, 2573, 3212, and 3014, in order to be granted tenure the classroom teacher or the building principal shall have received composite or overall annual professional performance review ratings pursuant to education Law 3012-c and/or 3012-d of either effective or highly effective in at least three (3) of the four (4) preceding years, or all three (3) years if serving a shortened probationary term. If the classroom teacher or building principal receives an ineffective composite or overall rating in the final year of the probationary period, he or she shall not be eligible for tenure at that time.
