Hello and WELCOME BACK! I hope that you have had an opportunity to enjoy some relaxing moments this summer. As summer winds down, we are excitedly preparing for another academic year. We look forward to new friendships, adjusting to new schedules, discovering new interests and strengths, and taking advantage of the exciting educational opportunities this year has to offer! We are ready to welcome our new 7th graders to the building and to watch another group of seniors prepare for their final year at Campbell-Savona!

We are excited to welcome all of our students back to the 2021-22 school year on Tuesday, September 7th. We are also excited to welcome some new members to our school community.

The school day for the Jr./Sr. High School for the 21-22 school year will be 7:40 – 2:35. Students should arrive to school by 7:50AM each day. We will be operating on an A/B schedule with nine periods each day, forty minutes in length. 7:50 – 8:05AM will be homeroom time. All students will be assigned to a homeroom/family group. One of our district goals going into this year is to not only work hard to support our students in their academic growth, but to also focus deeply into the social and emotional well-being of our students. We will also be integrating character education into our homeroom time to reinforce our PRIDE expectations. PRIDE is the acronym that represents the main character traits that we hope Campbell-Savona students exemplify: Proactivity, Resilience, Integrity, Diligence and Empathy.

We will once again have a 1:1 environment for students in grades 7-12. Each student will be assigned a device by the school to use throughout the day as a tool for their learning. All students must sign and return the Acceptable Use Policy before being issued a device, charger and laptop bag. 1:1 devices will be handed out in homeroom during the first week of school. Please bring back your signed AUP form the first week of school.

We are planning for a more “normal” school year, but at the same time are considering the “what-ifs” that may happen in regards to social-distancing and/or masking requirements in school. Please understand that we will always do the best we can to navigate any mandates that are given to us from the New York State Department of Health in consultation with the CDC with sincere empathy to our community. As we get closer to the start of the school year, we will provide information regarding the specific routines and health expectations as they are shared with the district.

We look forward to working closely with all of our parents and guardians this year as we support our students to become collaborators, critical thinkers, creative problem solvers, effective communicators and overall successful citizens prepared to make a positive difference. WELCOME BACK TO SCHOOL!

The AP office is super excited for the start of the school year and welcoming all of our students and staff back for another great year at CS!

In the following paragraphs you will be provided information that will be helpful to you, your student(s) and the school to have a successful year at CS Jr/Sr High School. All students will receive a copy of the handbook in their planner on the first day of school. We encourage parents to review this document with their children to prepare for a successful year. Together, as a team, we can work to provide the best educational experience for our students.

As a parent, you have entrusted your most valuable asset to us, your child, and we will continue to be diligent to ensure that your child is always safe while in our care. Your child's safety is our priority and we work very hard every period of everyday to ensure that each and every student in our building is accounted for. Daily attendance is extremely important to help our students meet their future goal of graduating from high school. We are here to help your child reach this goal.

The philosophy of our school is to help teach our students to be productive, respectful and responsible citizens of our community. Therefore, we use a variety of strategies to help our students learn appropriate behavior. Each situation is assessed and the best solution for that student to learn is administered. The goal is for the student to make a change in their behavior. At the Jr/Sr High School level, parents are not necessarily always contacted on inappropriate student behavior. We believe in developing meaningful relationships with our students and providing opportunities for students to demonstrate growth as a responsible school citizen.

We all have the same goal—your child's success in Jr/Sr High School! We look forward to working with you and your child in the upcoming school year!!

STUDENT PARENT CONTACT FORMS

We have enclosed your child's current contact and emergency information on a pink sheet of paper. Please review the enclosed "Student/Parent Contact Information Form" and keep the following things in mind when completing the form:

- There is a blank line under or next to your child's information. If the information has changed, please use the line to fill in the updated changes. If the information is accurate, please leave the line blank.
- Please include your email address if you have one. Teachers and staff members have access to this address and can use it as a way to communicate with you.
- The back side of the form asks for medical information. Please make sure you fill in the updated information for your child. Please note there is an area for you to indicate student physical information.
- We ask that all students have two (2) alternate people to contact in the event a parent is not available. If your child does not have two (2) people listed, please be sure to list two names here. There is a space for you to indicate if this person can pick your child up during the school day. Please mark those boxes accordingly.
- The emergency closing information is important for us to have on file. These are the plans we use when school has to close early for any reason. All children in the district need a plan on file for emergencies. **Please indicate the name of the person and the address within the district that you want your child to be sent to if school closes early**

We ask that you return this form to the Attendance office as soon as possible. You are welcome to mail it back to us, drop it off in person or send it in with your child on the first day of school. The school must receive the completed form no later than September 10, 2021.

TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Your child's transportation information will be mailed to you directly from the bus garage. This will include your student's bus number, pick up and drop off location as well as pick up and drop off times. Once you have received transportation information, if you have any changes or requests, please contact Lisa Nichols or Sarah Burgess at the bus garage at 527-4447.

The Campbell-Savona School District will be participating in an Emergency Go Home drill on Friday, October 8th, 2021. Students will be released from school 15 minutes early to go to their Emergency go Home location as indicated by you on the Student/parent Contact Information Form. This drill provides our students, staff and families the opportunity to prepare for a real emergency. Therefore, students will be required to go to their Emergency Go Home location and the School District will not accept alternative transportation requests for this day. Thank you for helping the Campbell-Savona School District plan for the safety of your child in the case of an emergency.

DIGNITY FOR ALL STUDENTS ACT

It is the expectation at Campbell-Savona Central School District that all students demonstrate outstanding character traits. Bullying and any type of harassment will not be permitted in school, on school property or on the school bus. Additional expectations regarding bullying and harassment will be shared with students during the 1st week of school.

ATTENDANCE

Regular classroom attendance is essential for a student to participate in and learn from the quality educational program at Campbell-Savona Jr/Sr High School. The responsibility for regular attendance is the combined effort of the student, family and school. Below are a few key reminders for all students and parents!

- A parent/guardian of an absent student should contact the Attendance Office at 527-9800, ext. 1420 by 9 a.m. to report the reason of the absence.
- Parents/guardians may send a note to the Attendance Office, Email sflint@cscsd.org or call the Attendance Office when their child is absent for all or any part of the day. If a legal absence excuse is not on file, the student will be marked as an illegal absence from school.
- Students are required to be in school from 7:50 a.m. – 2:32 p.m. Students who arrive after 7:50 a.m. must report to the Attendance Office for a late pass to class.
- Arrive on time to school. The expectation at Campbell-Savona Jr/Sr High School is that students will arrive at school at least 5 to 10 minutes before the start of school at 7:50 a.m.
- Students being excused from school early must sign out in the Attendance Office.

BUS NOTES: The Attendance Office must be notified by 11:00 am (unless it is an emergency) for any transportation changes. A note must be turned into the Attendance office or a phone call made by a parent/guardian prior to 11:00 am to ensure the change will take place. Please contact the Attendance Office at 527-9800, ext. 1420 for any changes.

Reminders for a student/parent/guardian when a student is absent:

- Whenever a student is absent s/he will be given the opportunity to make up work for absence(s) regardless of circumstances of the absence(s). This work must be made up within the same number of school days a student was absent. (i.e. absent one day, student has one school day to make up work.) In extenuating circumstances, the teacher and/or administration may approve additional time to make up work.
- In order for students to participate in extracurricular activities, they must be in attendance for a minimum of one half day with administration approval.
- All absences must be accounted for by the parent/legal guardian. It is the parent/legal guardian's responsibility to notify the school office with a verbal/written excuse within 5 school days upon the student's return to school.

STUDENT PARKING INFORMATION

The student parking lot is located in the rear of the building by the gym and athletic fields. In order to drive to school, students must complete the Car Registration Form, attend the driving assembly on Friday, September 10 at 7:50 in the LGI and submit a copy of their driver's license along with the signed driving contract. Students are expected to follow all school and traffic rules. Driving to school is a privilege that can be revoked at any time.

Required documentation will be available the first day of school. Parking spots will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis after the paperwork is turned in. Students who drove to school last year and were assigned a parking spot will need to follow this process and submit required documentation to receive approval for the new school year.

AFTER SCHOOL GUIDELINES

Students will be dismissed at 2:35 every day. For your student's safety, all students must be in a supervised area after 2:35 p.m. Please make after school arrangements with your student in advance. Students may not go to their lockers, wander the hallways or loiter in the Main Street lobby. Students not supervised after dismissal time will be asked to leave the building or call home for transportation.

AFTER SCHOOL STUDY HALL

Starting on September 7th from 2:35-3:05 an after-school study hall will be made available for students wanting a quiet place to work on academics while waiting for after school activities. School provided transportation is not provided for students attending the after-school study hall

EXTENDED SCHOOL DAY PROGRAM

Students may attend our Extended School Day Program Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and possibly Fridays starting on or about September 20. Students may drop in anytime between 2:40 – 4:10. School provided transportation is provided as long as they sign up before 1:00pm that day outside of the library.

CODE OF CONDUCT REMINDERS:

Student behavior must not interfere with the right of another student to receive an education or with a teacher's responsibility to perform their duties. Please follow the Campbell-Savona Jr/Sr High School student expectations as outlined in your planner.

Below are a few reminders:

- Attend school every day! Communicate attendance concerns with the attendance office.
- Food or drink may not be consumed in the hallways. Only bottled water is acceptable.
- Students must have a pass to be in the halls during class time.
- Follow student dress code.
- Personal Electronic devices are permitted during certain times of the day as outlined in the "Red, Yellow, Green Personal Device" expectations.
- The possession/use of any alcoholic product, drugs, or tobacco product including cigarettes, chewing tobacco, vape, lighters, etc. will not be permitted.
- Dismissal is at 2:35 p.m. every day. Students must be in a supervised area after this time.

DRESS CODE

The purpose of the District's Student Dress Code Policy is to clearly define acceptable student attire. The objective of the policy is to promote an atmosphere for academic success while recognizing freedom of student choice and expression. While our goal is to maintain consistency throughout the district, it is important to note that the following policy may be supplemented by specific building rules. Students and their parents have the primary responsibility for acceptable student dress and appearance. Teachers and all other district personnel should exemplify and reinforce acceptable student dress and help students develop an understanding of appropriate appearance in the school setting.

Please, be safe, appropriate and not disrupt or interfere with the educational process.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES


The school issues each student a 1:1 device that is to be used for educational purposes as outlined in the Authorize User Policy (AUP). Each student must agree to the terms and conditions of the Student Device User Agreement prior to receiving a school issued device.

Personal Electronic Devices are permitted to be used during the school day during appropriate times. The district has outlined, using a Red Yellow Green chart, times that a student can use their own device. The school asks that personal devices are not used to in a negative way as to interfere with the teaching and learning of others.

MEDICATION

Medicine of any kind can be given only when a physician's order requires that medication be given in school. Nonprescription medicine must have parental permission and a doctor's order. The parent must be sure that the proper form has been filed with the school nurse. All medication must be in the original container and must be brought into the Nurse by the parent/guardian. The school nurse will dispense all medication to the student in the Health Office.

STUDENT SCHEDULES

- A copy of your 2021-22 schedule is enclosed. Schedules are still subject to change so please do not bring the schedule to school with you on the first day. A finalized one will be handed out to you at the start of the day.
- Please look closely at your schedule and make sure you are taking the required courses that you need.
- We have reserved August 23rd and 30th from 9:00am-2:00pm as the time for students to make changes to their schedules. If you want to change your schedule you must do it in person in the Guidance Office on those days. There will be no changes made after that date until school has been in session for two weeks. As in past years, the add/drop time periods will begin at the start of the 3rd week of school (September 20th) and conclude at the end of the 5th week of school (October 8th). This timeline will once again be strictly adhered to.
- Academic Intervention Services (AIS) are provided to students in grades 7-12 through embedded support in the classroom and through additional AIS times. These classes are created to help students be successful in meeting graduation requirements and have been scheduled as needed at this point.

HONOR ROLL

Students achieving academic excellence each marking period will be recognized by being placed on the High Honor or Honor Roll. **General guidelines for such recognition are outlined below:**

- A 94.00 or above average is required for the High Honor Roll.
- An 88.00 to 93.99 average is required for the Honor Roll.

All Grades are used in tabulating the student's average. Students with any grades below a 70% are not eligible to be on the honor roll regardless of their overall average for the marking period. Students with incomplete grades are also not eligible unless their grades are complete by the end of the second week after the marking period ends. Students who maintain Honor Roll status for the first three marking periods will be invited to a scholastic achievement awards presentation.

7th GRADE ORIENTATION

We will be having an orientation night for 7th grade students and parents on Wednesday, September 1st at 6:00pm. You will have the opportunity to attend this meeting via ZOOM or in person in the Jr. /Sr. High School LGI. 7th grade teachers, Mrs. Meade and Ms. Wetherbee will all be on hand to share with you some important information about your upcoming school year. The night will begin with a power point presentation followed by any questions you may have for us. Student schedules will be available that evening and students will be allowed to bring in their school supplies and set up their locker as they will be receiving their locker information. An optional tour will also be available for those interested in becoming more familiar with the building. We hope to see you on the 1st.

Incoming 7th Grade Students—Things to Keep in Mind

- Supply lists have been included in this mailing. These list the different supplies that will be needed for each of your classes next year. Supply lists are also located on our website under the Guidance Office section.
- You will have a locker at the Jr./Sr. High School. We plan to have your locker information available to you at orientation so that you can get into your locker and get familiar with the location of it, your combination, etc. Students are allowed to bring in their supplies as we will be practicing opening their lockers; therefore, they are more than welcome to set things up and get their locker situated. Please think over the summer about ways to keep it organized throughout the year.
- If you have any questions about your schedule or are unsure of anything about 7th grade, please contact Ms. Wetherbee at 527-9800, ext. 2442. *Note: Ms. Wetherbee only works a few days over the summer but will return your call as soon as she gets your message. If your question is urgent, you can always contact Miss McGarvey, Guidance Secretary, at 527-9800, ext. 2440.*

PARENT PORTAL

Our student information system, School Tool, offers a *Parent Portal* as a resource for parents to use to access information about their child's school records through a secure Internet connection. Access to the *Parent Portal* is available to parents of all students. This is a very useful tool. After you register you will be able to access what work has been assigned to your child as well as grades for each assignment, quiz, and test. You are also able to e-mail teachers directly. Such access will be granted after parents register with the District and agree to the Acceptable Use Policy. In order to start this process, you must e-mail Ms. Geyer at cgeyer@cscsd.org with your name, child's name and grade along with your e-mail address. She will then e-mail you the acceptable use agreement and communicate training information after setting up your parent account. Parents of 7th grade students do not need to register again if they were signed up for the parent portal in the elementary building.

Other opportunities to keep current on your child's progress in school and to increase home/school communication are listed below:

Academic Watch List letters will be sent home to students and parents at the end of every 5 week mark (October 15th is the first one). The letters will communicate to parents the courses their child is struggling in indicating any course with an average below 70.

Open House will be held on September 14th from 6:00-7:00pm. We invite parents and students to come tour the school, meet faculty and staff members, and to learn more about student courses and schedules.

Report Cards for the first marking period will be sent home on November 12th.

Parent Teacher Conferences this year's parent-teacher conferences will be held on Monday, November 15th and Tuesday, November 23rd. We look forward to meeting with parents at this time of the year. If your child is in grades 7-10, it is best to meet with the team of teachers. Parents can sign up for conferences at open house or by contacting their child's guidance counselor.

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Fall is the time of year when high school seniors begin the important task of applying to colleges. Although some students will choose to apply to only one college, it may be to your advantage to apply to several. Regardless of the number of colleges you choose to apply to, the following process will help you avoid confusion and unnecessary delays. The following are some simple steps to help guide you through the college application process:

Step 1: When registering for the ACT or SAT, designate which colleges are to receive your results. Remember that you must send "official test scores" to each of the colleges in which you plan to apply. In most cases, those scores must come from the test company.

Step 2: Complete the college application form. It is a good idea to make a copy of the application and fill out a rough draft. This can be helpful in avoiding any confusion when filling out on your official application. Also, I would encourage students to apply on-line. If the application requires teacher or counselor recommendations, arrange for those immediately.

Step 3: Students applying on-line will need a credit card number for the application fee. Students mailing in their application will need to enclose a check for the appropriate amount. Do not use cash!

Step 4: An official high school transcript will need to be sent to the college from the Guidance Office. Students applying on-line will generally print a transcript request form that goes to the Guidance Office. Students applying by mail need to bring their completed application, fee and recommendation (if applicable) to the Guidance Office. Ms. Williamee will review the application with students to make sure it is properly filled out. Finally, we will mail your application for you.

COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS:

Many colleges and universities require either the SAT or the ACT as part of their admissions procedure. The scores on these tests are considered along with the high school courses seniors have taken, the grades they have earned, the activities that they have participated in, and (sometimes) a personal interview and/or an essay they write on a topic usually suggested by the college. Many of the seniors should plan to take one of these exams this fall. Juniors should consider taking them in the spring of their junior year. PSAT:

PSAT/NMSQT stands for Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. It's a standardized test that provides firsthand practice for the SAT Reasoning Test. The PSAT/NMSQT measures:

- critical reading skills
- math problem-solving skills
- writing skills

The most common reasons for taking the PSAT/NMSQT are:

- to receive feedback on your strengths and weaknesses on skills necessary for college study. You can then focus your preparation on those areas that could most benefit from additional study or practice.
- to see how your performance on an admissions test might compare with that of others applying to college. to help prepare for the SAT. You can become familiar with the kinds of questions and the exact directions you will see on the SAT.
- to receive information from colleges when you check "yes" to Student Search Service.

Sophomores and Juniors who want to take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 13 must sign up in the guidance office by Monday, September 13. The cost of the exam is \$18.00.



FOOD SERVICE:

One of the most important ways in which we can help our children perform better in the classroom is to provide them with the nutrition necessary for a healthy growth of their minds and bodies. The School Food Service Program offers students breakfast and lunch in both the elementary and middle/high school buildings.

Campbell Savona Central School is participating in the Community Eligibility Provision. All students enrolled at Campbell Savona Central school are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at no charge each day of the 2021-2022 school year regardless of household income. The Household Income Eligibility Form calendar insert is to determine eligibility for additional State and Federal program benefits that your child(ren) may qualify for.

Pre-payment is required for purchasing ala carte items. Campbell Savona CSD has a pre-payment online option called School Pay. School Pay can be accessed by logging into www.cscsd.org > Services > Food Service > SchoolPay.


