

Updated COVID Protocols for Unvaccinated Close Contacts of a Positive Individual

Per the NYSDOH and Steuben County Public Health Department, the Campbell-Savona Central School District will implement the Test to Stay (TTS) and Test out of Quarantine strategies. These strategies allow asymptomatic and unvaccinated direct contacts of positive individuals to continue attending school or return to school faster if appropriate follow-up action is taken.

If an unvaccinated student or staff member is identified as a close contact of a COVID-19 positive individual, the individual has three options:

1. **Quarantine.** Complete 10 days of quarantine as mandated by the NYS Department of Health. The individual may return to school/work on the 11th day after contact as long as they have not become symptomatic and/or tested positive for COVID-19 during their quarantine.
2. **Test out of Quarantine.** The individual quarantines for 7 full days. The individual remains asymptomatic, they can return to school on day 8 as long as they receive a negative Covid-19 lab test within 48 hours of the 7th day of quarantine.
3. **Test to Stay (TTS).** The individual continues to report to school by testing negative with an antigen test (ex. Binax NOW/CareStart) on each school day for seven days after exposure.

The following information and guidelines must be followed if the individual chooses “**Test to Stay.**”

- All families/staff may take advantage of this free testing option. The District must have a signed consent form on file in order to perform the testing.
- The daily test must be conducted in the Savona Elementary Small Gym from 7:35-8:45 am. Please park in the visitor or staff parking lot and enter through the doors by the small gymnasium. **DO NOT PARK IN THE BUS CIRCLE.**
 - If negative, the student/staff proceeds to class. (If student attends Jr/Sr High, the parent must transport to Campbell after being tested).
 - If positive, the student/staff is sent home and existing procedures are followed.
- Students will not be permitted to ride the school bus in the morning during the 7 day TTS protocol. However, students may ride the remainder of that day only.
- Adults accompanying students to school for testing must wait 10-15 minutes for the test results before they can leave.
- **The direct contact who is allowed to remain in school through TTS must still be quarantined outside of school instruction/academic periods**— No community activities or extracurricular participation including clubs, sports, arts/performance activities is permitted while the student remains in quarantine. The student/staff member may only go from home to school for instruction and back home again.
- If the exposed person remains in school through TTS and develops symptoms, they must be excluded from school per current school guidance. If the person tests negative in the morning but becomes symptomatic during the school day, they must be sent home and complete their quarantine without a repeat COVID test.
- **Home tests will not be accepted.**
- A school test is not required on weekends and holidays when the seven-day TTS period is still active unless the 6th and 7th day fall on a weekend or break. In that case, the student must be transported to Savona Elementary School on the 8th day and test in the small gym. If the test is negative, the student may discontinue quarantine and return to school with no restrictions.
- If the individual misses a day of testing while undergoing the TTS protocol, they will discontinue the TTS protocol and will immediately transition to the Test out of Quarantine or full Quarantine protocol.
- If the exposed person remains in school through TTS and develops symptoms, they must be excluded from school per current school guidance. If the person tests negative in the morning but becomes symptomatic during the school day, they must be sent home and complete their quarantine without a repeat COVID test.

ATTENDANCE

School attendance is an important factor for students to be successful in school. Students should arrive by 7:50 each day. We ask that students make every effort to be in school. ELECTRONIC DEVICES

The Administration strives to provide an environment for our students in which they are able to learn without distractions. Electronic devices, in particular cell phones, can be a distraction to the student, to their peers and to the teacher. This year students may use their device in homeroom, lunch and in classrooms with teacher permission. If students need to contact their parent/guardian, the student should report to the Assistant Principal's office to make those arrangements. Parents are encouraged to contact the school directly when they need to reach their child throughout the school day. We trust that our students and parents/guardians will respect the learning environment by following these expectations.

ACADEMIC WATCH LIST

We have revamped our SOS and AWL procedures. Please see guidelines below.

- Students who receive a grade of 69 or below for one or more courses at the end of the 5-week midterm date and/or at the end of the 10 week marking period are placed on the academic watch list.
- An updated academic watch list will be posted every Monday. The list runs from Monday to Sunday. All students and the course or courses they are on the list for are listed on this document.
- Students remain on the academic watch list until the next grading period (5 or 10 week grades).
- An "OKAY" will appear next to the name of each student on the list who has met the requirements and can participate in the following week's activities. To earn an okay, students need to complete work for the week that meets our academic watch list standards of 70% or above. This is determined by the teachers of the classes the student is on the list for. This does not mean the student is passing the course. It means the student has made the effort that week and has attended class, participated and completed assignments, tests, and quizzes to earn a grade of 70% or higher for the week. In addition to earning a 70+ for the week, students must attend SOS twice to be eligible. SOS happens from 2:35-3:05 every day in room 2010 with Mrs. Bulkley. Mrs. Bulkley will gather this information weekly on Friday by emailing teachers regarding students in question.

Participation in Athletics, other Extra-curricular and School Activities:

If a student athlete is on the academic watch list for one or more courses, they are able to continue to participate in practices. To participate in athletic contests, students will need to complete satisfactory work for the week in identified courses (70%+) and attend two SOS sessions.

APPROPRIATE DRESS

A student's dress, grooming and appearance shall be safe, appropriate and not interfere with the educational process. With the weather turning cold outside, please stress the importance of dressing appropriately for the weather.

“CIRCLE 50” ACTION PLAN

A circle 50 means that the student will receive a 50 on their report card, but their actual grade may be lower. This can only occur during the first half of a course for students in grades 7-12. By receiving a circle 50 the student is able to still have the opportunity to pass this class by doing well for the remainder of the course.

If a student receives a grade lower than a 50 or a circle 50, their guidance counselor will work with the student and the teacher to fill out the Action Plan explaining why the student received this grade. This Action Plan will ask for information from the teacher as well as the student on why the student earned a grade less than a 50. The plan will also be shared with parents so we can work together to develop a course of action that will provide the student with the support necessary for future success in the class.

SENIOR AND JUNIOR CONFERENCES

Mr. Holmes has been busy meeting with seniors to help them prepare for their post-secondary plans. Many seniors are planning on attending college next fall. It is important for all college-bound seniors to stay on top of deadlines and get their application packages sent in to their schools. For non college-bound students, Mr. Holmes is working on resumes, cover letters, interview skills and finding employment opportunities with students. He has started meeting individually with juniors to discuss graduation requirements, post-secondary plans, scholarship opportunities and diploma types.

8th GRADE AND FRESHMAN CONFERENCES

Ms. Wetherbee has started her year by meeting with freshman students for their individual conferences. Ms. Wetherbee discusses a four year plan for high school including graduation requirements, course selections and the college/career planning process. She also talks with each student about their interests, strengths, future career plans and how she can help them in their career exploration journey.

GEAR UP FOR FINANCIAL AID

Now is the time for seniors to apply for college financial aid for the upcoming school year. Federal financial aid is available for students attending four-year, two-year, public or private, career or trade schools. We are hosting Ms. Shalena Clary, Director of Financial Aid at Corning Community College, for a Financial Aid Night. This is a two-part event that will include an information session and a session to complete the FAFSA with an expert. Session one will be Monday, November 29th from 5:45 to 7:45 and session two will be Thursday, December 2nd from 5:45 to 7:15.
